- Objectives
 - To measure socioeconomic outcome of low income families in AMP Adopt A Family & Youth Scheme (AFYS)
 - To enhance staff capability
- 3 components
 - Impact Assessment Tool
 - **Capability Training for Caseworkers**
 - On-line Blended Learning portal
- 3 year project




KEY FEATURES

- 1) Impact Assessment Tool (IAT)
 - Customised Scorecard
 - Pre & Post intervention measures based on 6 key dimensions
 - Family and social conditions
 - ➤ Job Search / Employability
 - ➤ Skills development efforts
 - > Financial and savings
 - Spiritual and mindset
 - Planning for Children's Education
 - 22 families (141 beneficiaries) ----- 150 families



IAT - SCORECARD




IAT - EMERGING TRENDS

- Rise in the overall employment levels
 - lower monthly household salary
 - increased dissatisfaction on job-matching and
 - a significant increase in household expenses
- Improvements in children's education and household debts
- No major improvements in families' spiritual position
 - constrained by ability to strike a balance between duniawi and ukhrawi matters
- Negative habits have been curtailed

Quadrant A

Families on track to achieve self-reliance. They have high overall rating & high family dynamics.

Quadrant C

Families require further intervention to improve overall performance.

Quadrant D

In general, the families need to invest more in enhancing the family bonds and marital ties.



KEY FEATURES

- 2) Capability Training
 - Technical skills & Soft skills
 - Development of scorecards
 - Linkages between dimensions
 - Usage of analytics and metrics in case management
 - Scoring-based approach with human intervention
 - 9 staff involved in 1st year



STRATEGIC IMPLICATIONS OF PROJECT

Emphasis on Quality Beneficiary Engagement

- Provides more time for quality beneficiary engagement by removing 50% of case workers' administrative and preliminary analytical tasks
- Supported by on-line blended learning portal

Enhancing Capability and Building Capacity

- System generated scores, detailed analysis and roadmaps increases accuracy and objectivity of assessment
- Speed of assessment and reports generated contributes to increased productivity
- Shorter learning curve for new caseworkers: 6 months to 3 months
- Standardised service standards



STRATEGIC IMPLICATIONS OF PROJECT

Systematic Approach to Enhancing Outcomes for Clients

- Tracking and monitoring cases areas that have shown improvement or need more time for improvement can be better identified and addressed
- Policies and programmes can be reviewed to map against the aggregate roadmap recommendations

Governance and Stakeholder Reporting

 Enhanced reporting tool for donors and sponsors to ensure that the Social Return on Investment (SROI) is achieved
